After a brief pause of our clinical activities due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are pleased to inform you that the PCRU is resuming our operations with extra precautions.

These precautions have been put in place to:

- Limit the spread of COVID-19.
- Preserve the health of our participants and staff, as well as their families and loved ones.

Please find below some information to help you prepare for your visit.



BEFORE YOUR VISIT:



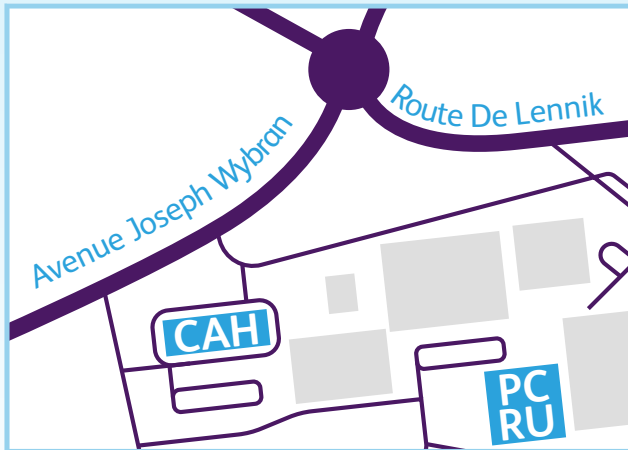
Our participants are kindly asked **not to come to the PCRU** if they have any COVID-19 symptoms.



We advise you to **travel by car and avoid public transport**. However, if this is not possible, and you do travel by public transport, kindly **wear a mask** which covers your nose and mouth.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

Until further notice, we will be using the **CAH building, situated at 40, Avenue Joseph Wybran - 1070 Brussels**, as a screening location.



For your safety, as well as their own, all our staff will be wearing **masks, face shields, gowns and gloves**.



Once you arrive at the CAH building, you will be greeted by our clinical staff, who will:



Guide you through signing an Informed Consent Document (ICD) for the nasopharyngeal (NP) swab COVID-19 test.



Perform a temperature check.



Perform a NP swab COVID-19 test by collecting secretions from the back of the nose and throat. This method is used in common medical practice in order to diagnose certain viral infections.



You will be requested to wait for your results for approximately 45 minutes.



If your results are negative, you will be asked to proceed to the PCRU location (Erasmé Day Hospital, Route de Lennik, 808 - 1070 Brussels), **wearing your mask at all times**.

At the PCRU, you will once again be greeted by our clinical staff, who will guide you through signing an ICD for the clinical study and perform the necessary screening tests.

How to put on, use, take off and dispose of a mask

1



Before putting on a mask, wash hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water

2



Cover mouth and nose with mask and make sure there are no gaps between your face and the mask

Avoid touching the mask while using it; if you do, clean your hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water

3



Replace the mask with a new one as soon as it is damp and do not re-use single-use masks

4



To remove the mask: remove it from behind (do not touch the front of mask); discard immediately in a closed bin; wash hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water
